Happy New Year everyone!!

What a great 2025 we had and we cannot wait to spend 2026 with you. The event schedule is attached in the newsletter and I'll go into detail regarding our first big event below...

Super Bowl Scramble: \$30 + any cart fees

Members Only, Men and Women, 4 Player Scramble Format

Sign up Individually, and we will make teams randomly in ABCD style based off your GHIN Handicap Index

Come and play in this one of a kind tournament where NET Birdies and NET Eagles matter and Luck will take care of the rest. The club will provide a scoreboard with 100 squares on it. On the X-Axis will be one super bowl team, the Y-Axis the other. Numbers will be randomly drawn 0-9, and placed on the board for both teams.

The more you are under par, the more squares on the board your team gets to claim. For example, if your team had 4 NET Birdies and 1 NET Eagle, you would get to choose 6 squares to claim. After all teams have completed the round, we continue to fill out the board until all 100 squares are filled. Thats where the fun starts.

At the end of the 1st Quarter, the score will reflect who our 4th place team is. If the Panthers are on the left side (Y-Axis) and the Patriots are on the top (X-Axis) and the score is 14-3 in favor of the panthers, you would go to the square that meets the 3 for the Patriots, and the 4 (second number of 14) for the Panthers, and whoever claimed that square wins 4th place. This process is repeated for the end of the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th quarters of the Super Bowl, where our Super Bowl Scramble Champions would be decided by the selection of squares for the final score of the game. It will be a ton of fun! (Stay afterwards for some SuperBowl Appetizers and watch the game with us on the Big Screen)

Winter Simulator League

Format: Two Person Scramble Format (men's, women's, and mixed teams welcome!) Nine holes each week, handicaps will be used, each match will be a total of 10 points with each hole being worth a point, and the overall match being a point.

Tees: Men - 6400 yards (apprx), Seniors (65 and up) - 5800 yards (apprx), Women - 4800 yards (appx)

Matches: Teams will play one match per week that can be scheduled during Pro Shop hours Monday-Sunday. Play will start the week of January 19th and run through March 30th.

Costs: League fee of \$20 will be due by the first week of the league. Weekly fee will be \$15.

Prizes: There will be weekly prizes and overall prizes. Also, we'll have closest to the pin prizes and "Cheese" prizes (putts made outside of 8ft.)

Playoffs: Four teams will make the playoffs and compete in a bracket style format to determine an overall champion.

League Meeting: There will be a meeting on Saturday, January 17th in which one team member must be present to go over the rules and how the simulator works.

Practice round: Each team will be offered an 18 hole practice round prior to league play to get used to the simulator.

Golf Courses: A different course will be played each week. Courses include Pebble Beach, St. Andrews, Royal Birkdale, etc..

GOLF COURSE UPDATE

Damage caused by
foot traffic while
greens had frost

This time of year frost is always a topic of conversation. Delays can understandably cause frustration amongst golfers. Here are a few things golfers should know when it comes to frost delays...

Crunchy grass is vulnerable to damage

Golf course turf is normally resilient to traffic, but when ice crystals form inside the plants, they become brittle. Walking or driving over frost-covered grass can rupture plant cells, leading to dead turf, or the plants may be weakened without immediately showing the effects. It can take grass more than a month to recover from this damage.

Location is everything

You look out the kitchen window and see no signs of frost, only to find a frost delay when you get to the course. Know that frost can linger in colder microclimates long after other areas have thawed. North-facing slopes, low-lying areas and areas sheltered from the wind are especially likely to remain covered with frost. When in doubt, call the golf shop to check on course conditions before leaving home.

Closely mown turf is at high risk

Frost damage can occur throughout the course, but it poses the greatest risk to closely mown turf. Putting greens are particularly vulnerable because they experience the most concentrated traffic. A foursome typically takes 300 steps or more per green; with frost present, each step could cause serious damage.

Looks can be deceiving

No signs of frost on the first tee doesn't mean an immediate "all clear" sign. If frost remains in unavoidable areas early in the round, the course must remain closed. Also, remember that once the frost is totally clear, the maintenance staff will still need time to catch up on course preparation before play can begin.

More light goes a long way

Shade extends frost delays by preventing sunlight from melting the frost. Pruning or removing trees that shade primary playing surfaces can improve the course's overall health and reduce the duration of frost delays. This is especially true on the first few holes, where the shade from a handful of trees can keep an entire course closed.



Bulkhead Repair on #18

We had a couple of big rain storms during the month of December that washed out our bulkhead on hole #18. The work to fix this is scheduled during the week of January 5th. We'll have a temporary green for a few days while the work is being completed. This will ensure the workers are safe as the job is being completed.
